The Faroes are part of Denmark, but enjoy extensive home rule. They have their own history, their own language, their own art and culture, their own flag. In spite of the recent modern development the Faroese people has retained much of the original Nordic culture now lost elsewhere in Scandinavia, and a visit to the Faroes thus offers a valuable introduction to the North for the one not yet familiar with Scandinavia as well as an opportunity to obtain further background knowledge for the more experienced traveller.
